GENERAL REQUIREMENTS FOR GRADUATION with BS

(See General Bulletin for more details)

- 1. General Education completed with a 2.0 GPA; completion of State Core Requirements & University Requirements.
- 2. A Minimum of 120 unduplicated credit hours.
- 3. A minimum of 45 credit hours of 3000-4000 level courses, 30 of which must be taken at FSU.
- 4. Nine credits in summer (only for students enrolling in FSU with less than 60 credit hours)
- 5. Last 30 credit hours and half of major course hours at FSU.
- 6. Completion of major course requirements; a grade of B- or higher in each required prerequisite, a grade of C- or higher in all other required major courses unless noted otherwise.
- 7. A University Academic Progress Check with Registrar's Office.
- 8. A College Academic Progress Check with your assigned academic advisor.
